Ms Dempsey was delighted as Shuttleworth also collected the Career Aspiration Award. Ms Dempsey, alongside other

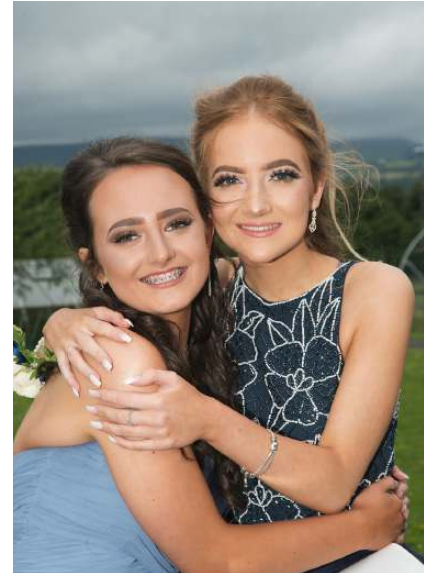

Shuttleworth College students tested a model of a nuclear reactor, watched chemistry experiments and took part in an engineering workshop as part of the Lancashire Science Festival.

The event was held at UCLAN with 29 Year 7 and 8 students exploring STEM (science, technology, engineering and maths) subjects.

“It was a superb day,” said Technology Teacher Ms Hughes. “The students engaged with the floor show exhibition, watched a range of colourful and fiery chemistry experiments and also

took part in an engineering workshop where they had to use triangulation to build strong structures – which they did successfully!

“All the pupils on the trip were brilliant, they behaved perfectly and were a credit to the school. “One pupil told me it was a day she will always remember.

“The trip was enjoyable as well as educational, it was great for the pupils to meet scientists and university students to learn more about possible future careers.”



'Your Future, Your Choice' careers week



Shuttleworth College Year 10 students have started to plan for their future at the school's 'Your Future, Your Choice' award-winning careers week.

The students were based at Burnley College where they learnt about applications and interview techniques, labour market information plus apprenticeship opportunities.

There were team building and communication activities in addition to psychometric testing and mock interviews.

Thanks to Shuttleworth's link-up with Inspira's Kay Vaughan, they also got to visit some of Burnley's top industries and sample a day in the life there.

This included Warburton's, AMS Neve, Calico, Veka, Boohoo, Kaman Tooling, 2BR with Safran Nacelles informing the students about apprenticeships.

"I want to be an engineering apprentice so it was useful," said student Mackenzie O'Leary. "We had an assessment and filled in a mock apprenticeship form so we are prepared for next year."

Student Rosie Whatmough went to Warburton's, she said: "I was amazed how big it was, how many machines there were and we were lucky enough to come away with a goody bag. We had to wear hair nets and no jewellery to make sure nothing was contaminated."

At 2BR students made their own advert, at clothes

giant Boohoo, they came away with sunglasses while they got a tour round various industries to learn what it takes to work there and the different jobs available.

Shuttleworth College recently won the Careers Aspiration Award at the East Lancashire Education Awards and they have been leading the way in helping their students examine career options.

"It was a rewarding week for our Year 10s," said Miss Dempsey. "At the end of the week, they had to stand up and tell everyone else what they had learnt and, while it is nerve racking, we could see how their confidence had grown over the week.

"We want to give our students the best possible chance to pursue their dreams and give them as much knowledge as possible about the options available to them.

"They have developed skills and understanding to make them as employable as possible and it's a springboard to go onwards and upwards – they now know what they have got to do."
