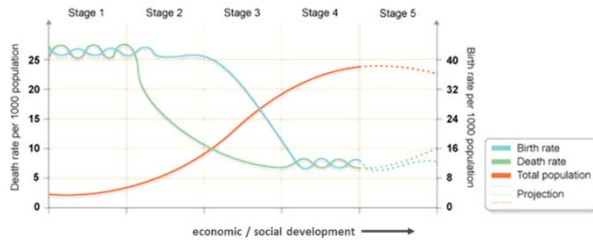

- The **DTM** shows how birth rates and death rates affect population growth over time.
- This is influenced by **development**.
- Different **countries pass through the stages** in the model at **different times** and at **different speeds**.
- In the early stages of the model **birth rates** and **death rates** are **high**, but they both decline as a country becomes more developed over time.
- If DR is higher than BR there is population decrease, if BR is higher than DR, the population will increase.

The 3 causes of uneven development:



physical
natural characteristics or events.



economic
characteristics of the country's wealth and how it makes money.

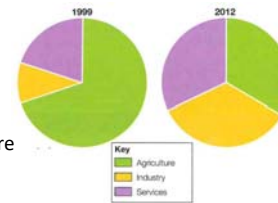


historical

| industrial structure | the percentage of people working in each job type. |
| Quality of life | the standard of health, comfort, and happiness experienced by an individual or group. |
| Gross National Income per capita | The amount of money generated by a country (domestic and overseas) divided by the number of people in the population. |

Tourism

What is it? Countries such as Jamaica, with tropical beaches, spectacular landscapes or abundant wildlife encourage tourists from overseas to visit

How does it support development? Big hotel chains invest in the country and many jobs are created in the leisure and tourism sector. Infrastructure is developed (e.g. ports and airports) to support the tourists, but local people also benefit. Increases in tax revenues can be invested in healthcare and education.
