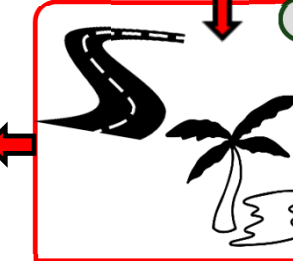
Strategies used to reduce the risk of desertification – water and soil management, tree planting and use of appropriate technology.
