Source	Where?	Christianity Quotes	Meaning
Bible	Genesis 27	So God created mankind in his own image.	God created all of life in his own image.
Bible	Exodus	Thou shalt not kill.	Do not kill – as found in the Ten Commandments
Bible	Job 21	I, your God, give life, and I take it away.	Only God has the right to give and take life.

Contrasting Beliefs		
Abortion	ROMAN CATHOLICS: Believe that abortion is always wrong.	ANGLICAN: Many Anglicans accept abortion as a necessary evil.
Euthanasia	ROMAN CATHOLICS: Active euthanasia is always wrong as life is sacred.	CHRISTIANITY: Christians generally accept passive euthanasia, for example switching off life support.
Animal Experimentation	ROMAN CATHOLICS: Accepts experiments on animals within reasonable limits and only if it is caring for or saving human lives.	CHRISTIANITY: Some Christians think experimentation is wrong due to the role of stewardship.
