

#### Key Resources for Islamic Beliefs and Teachings:

Qur'an - The Qur'an is the most important holy book in Islam, and the highest source of authority for all matters relating to Islamic teaching, practice and law.

Torah - It was revealed to Musa. Some Muslims think that the Torah is the first five books of the Bible, but altered from the original text.

Psalms – It was revealed to David. Many Muslims accept that the Psalms mentioned in the Qur'an are similar to the ones in the Bible.

Gospel – It was revealed to Isa. Muslims believe the Gospel has been lost but some of its message is still found in the Bible. **Scrolls of Abraham –** It was revealed to Ibrahim. These are considered to be one of the earliest scriptures in Islam, and no longer exist.

Sunni Islam	Sunni Muslims follow the Six Articles of Faith for their key beliefs. The majority of Muslims are followers of Sunni Islam.
Shi'a Islam	Shi'a Muslims follow the Five Roots of 'Usul ad-Din.
