

Topic – Theme B: Religion and Life



Specification: How was the World Created? The focus is to understand the theories behind how the world was created.

Skills: Explanation - 4 mark contrasting/similar views.



Specification: What is the Scientific Explanation for Creation? The focus is to look at how science explains how the world was created and the evidence to support it.

Skills: Development of knowledge. Explanation – 5 mark question with reference to scripture.



Specification: What is the Religious Explanation for Creation? The focus is to look at how religion explains how the world was created and the concept behind religious truth.

Skills: Recall of knowledge – 2 mark question.



Specification: Can there only be One Explanation for Creation? The focus is on the debate whether religious theory and scientific theory can combine.

Skills: Explanation – 4 mark – similarities and differences.



Specification: What is Stewardship? To focus is on looking at whose responsibility it is to look after the world and why.

Skills: Evaluation of statements – 12 mark question.



Specification: What is Religion's Attitude Towards the Environment? The focus is understanding how religious people view the environment.

Skills: Development of knowledge. Explanation – 5 mark question with reference to scripture.



Specification: End of Unit Assessment. The focus is on bringing all the knowledge of the topic together and applying it to GCSE questions

Skills: Skills: Summative assessment point. GCSE style questions including 1, 2, 4, 5 and 12 marks.



Specification: Is There an Afterlife? The focus is on understanding what religious people believe about the afterlife and how their actions in life can influence this.

Skills: Development of knowledge. Explanation – 5 mark question with reference to scripture.



Specification: What is Euthanasia? The focus is on understanding what euthanasia is and what religious people think about this act.

Skills: Skills: Recall of knowledge – 2 mark question.



Specification: Is it Ever Right to End a Life? The focus is on the concept of abortion and the contrasting views in which Christianity has on this.

Skills: Explanation – 4 mark – similarities and differences.



Specification: What is the Value of Human Life? The focus is on the understanding how Christians view the value of life, due to it being God given.

Skills: Evaluation of statements – 12 mark question.



Specification: What Rights do Animals Have? The focus is on looking at how animals should be treated, linking to the ideas of stewardship and dominion.

Skills: Evaluation of statements – 12 mark question.
