
Topic: Paper Two – Theme D: Religion, Peace and Conflict



Specification: What is Religion, Peace and Conflict? The focus is on understanding why war occurs and what its aim is.

Skills: Recall of knowledge – 2 mark question.



Specification: What is
Forgiveness and Reconciliation?
The focus is to understand the impact of a breakdown of relationships and how to fix this.

Skills: Explanation – 4 mark – similarities and differences.



Specification: Is Violence Ever Justified? The focus is on looking at what violence in its different forms and how it can be deemed justifiable.

Skills: Evaluation of statements – 12 mark question.



Specification: What is a Violent Protest? – Terrorism. The focus is on what terrorism is and its apparent links with religion.

Skills: Development of knowledge. Explanation – 5 mark question with reference to scripture.




Specification: Why Do People Go To War? To focus on the reasons why people go to war and the religious beliefs behind going to war.

Skills: Explanation – 4 mark – similarities and differences.



Specification: What are Religious Attitudes Towards the Possibility of Nuclear War? The focus is on the use of weapons, earth nuclear or WoMD and what the religious beliefs on this are

Skills: Evaluation of statements – 12 mark question.



Specification: End of Unit Assessment. The focus is on bringing all the knowledge of the topic together and applying it to GCSE questions

Skills: Summative assessment point. GCSE style questions including 1, 2, 4, 5 and 12 marks.



Specification: How Does Religion Respond to Victims of War? The focus is on looking at how religions support those who are in need after being caught up in war.

Skills: Explanation – 4 mark – similarities and differences.



Specification: Where is There Peace-making in Contemporary Britain? The focus is looking at key individuals or groups who are promoting peace in Britain.

Skills: Recall of knowledge – 2 mark question.



Specification: What is Pacifism?
The focus is understanding
people's views on the use of war
and violence and what religion's
view on this is.

Skills: Evaluation of statements – 12 mark question.



Specification: Is Religion a Cause of Violence? The focus is on how religion can lead to tensions between nations and result in war.

Skills: Explanation – 4 mark – similarities and differences.



Specification: What is the Criteria for a Just War? The focus is on what a just war is and what traditional Christian rules on just war and that they are accepted by other religions.

Skills: Development of knowledge. Explanation – 5 mark question with reference to scripture.
