KS3 <b>History</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Every 3 weeks</li> </ul>	1.5 hours	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Students select either a Create, Write or Report task to complete over the 3 week period. This is linked the topics students are studying in class and allows students to develop their understanding in a way that suits them best.</li> <li>• Work is set in a homework book.</li> </ul>	Marked by teacher against success criteria given to students at the start of the project.
KS4 <b>History</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Weekly</li> </ul>	1 hour	<p>Y10</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Term 1 Medicine Through Time homework booklet. Pages set each week to develop understanding of content covered in class.</li> </ul> <p>Y11</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• HT1 – Cold War homework booklet. Revision homework set in booklet using revision guide to help students complete work set.</li> <li>• HT2 – Medicine homework booklet as above.</li> <li>• HT3 – Weimar and Nazi Germany homework booklet.</li> <li>• HT4 – Anglo Saxon and Norman England homework booklet.</li> <li>• HT5 – Exam skills revision booklet.</li> </ul>	One Do Now a week is allocated to homework to allow for understand to be checked.
KS3 <b>Geography</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Weekly</li> </ul>	30 minutes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Knowledge recall task completed on worksheets</li> <li>• An extension research task is also given each week in order to develop understanding.</li> </ul>	One Do Now a week allocated to assessing homework.
KS4 <b>Geography</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Weekly</li> </ul>	1 hour	<p>Y11</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Homework is focused on revision, starting with Paper One content covered within Y10 before moving onto Paper 2. Students are given what to revise with ideas on how to do this, this is then followed up with a question booklet, low stake questions - focused on recall.</li> </ul>	One Do Now a week allocated to assessing homework.
KS4 <b>Travel and Tourism</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Weekly</li> </ul>	1 hour	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• T&amp;T homework is based on skills needed for their coursework for component 2.</li> </ul>	One Do Now a week allocated to assessing homework.
KS4 <b>Religious Education</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Weekly</li> </ul>	1 hour	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Y10:</li> <li>• HT1 Paper one and two overviews consisting of knowledge based questions</li> <li>• HT2 - Paper one and two religious references - students will be given</li> </ul>
