Sentence Types

You can use clauses to build up the four main types of sentence types.

Simple – contains one main clause.

Theseus was strong.

Compound – contains two main clauses joined together with a conjunction (e.g. and).

Theseus was strong and he didn't give up.

Complex – contains a main clause and a subordinate clause.

After he had defeated the minotaur, Theseus returned home.

Complex-compound – contains a main clause, a subordinate clause and another main clause that is joined with a conjunction.

After he had defeated the minotaur, Theseus returned home and was made king.

Paragraphs

A handy way of remembering when to change paragraph is 'TiP ToP'.

Each time one of these changes you should think about starting a new paragraph:

- Time
- Place
- Topic
- Person

Parts of a Sentence:

SUBJECT: A subject in a sentence is the person, place or thing that is performing the action.

VERB: The 'verb' in a sentence is just what the subject of a sentence is doing. In terms of sentences, this can mean that it is more than one word.

OBJECT: The object of a sentence is the thing that is on the receiving end of the action.

COMPLEMENT: This tells us more about an object or subject. They are usually nouns or adjectives.
