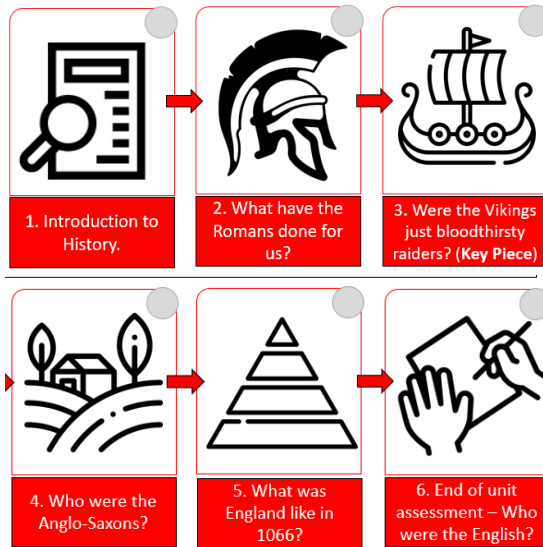

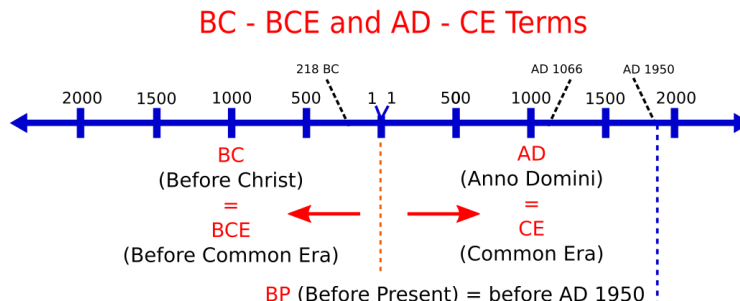

AD	Anno Domini - in the year of our Lord.
anachronism	Something placed in the wrong time period. E.g. a car in the Medieval Times.
BC	Before Christ - used to denote any dates before the birth of Christ.
bias	Having an unfair or unbalanced opinion.
century	Period of 100 years. E.g. the year 2018 is in the 21st century.
chronology	Events in the correct order of when they happened.
evidence	Facts or information that can help us form an idea of the past.
primary source	Evidence that was created at the time of the event.
secondary source	An individual's interpretation of a historical event.
timeline	Representation of a period of time, where key events are marked.

An easy way to remember how to work out centuries is to cover up the last two numbers and add one.
1666 is 16 + 1 = 17 Therefore 1666 was in the 17th century.

To work out what century a year is in subtract 1 and then add any number between 0 and 99.
20th century is 20 - 1 = 19 Therefore the 20th century is from 1900-1999.
