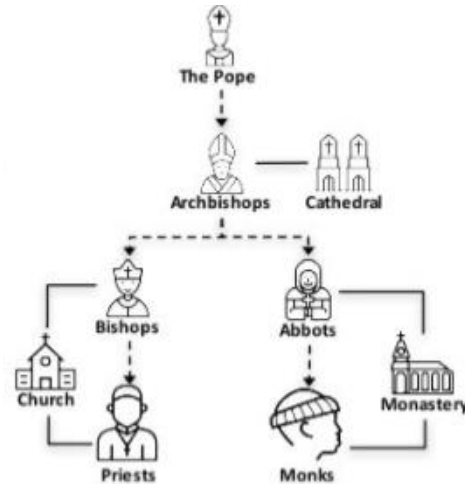
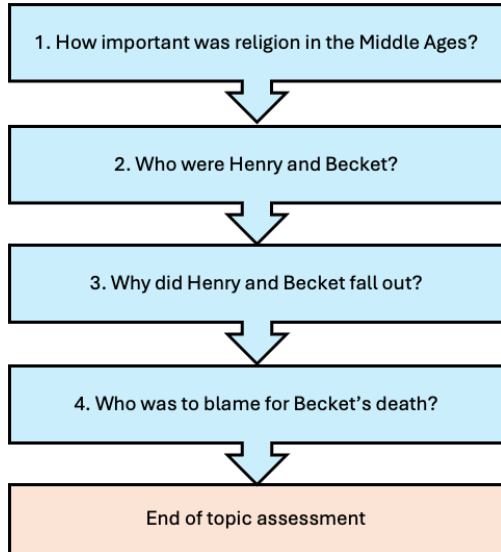


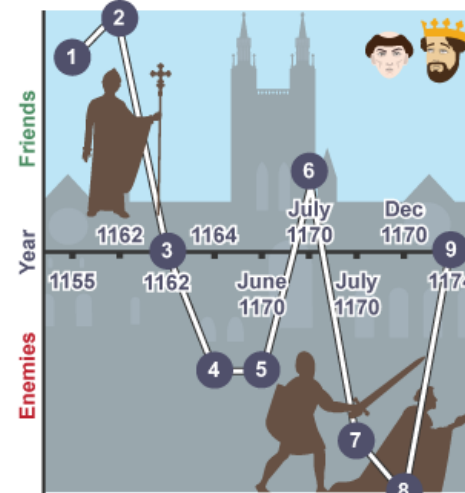

Archbishop	a person of high importance in the English Church	Loyal	supporting someone, even in difficult times
Cathedral	a very large and important church building	Martyr	someone who is willing to die for their beliefs
Canterbury	a town in the southeast of England	Monarch	the person in control of the country, eg. King or Queen
Cause	the reason why something happened	Murder	the unlawful killing of a person
Excommunicated	a severe punishment - being banished from the Church	Pilgrimage	a religious journey

- Henry II appoints Thomas Becket as the Chancellor.
- Henry II appoints Thomas Becket as the Archbishop of Canterbury.
- Thomas Becket resigns as Chancellor.
- Henry II and Thomas Becket fight about the Constitutions of Clarendon. Becket flees to France.
- Henry II's son is crowned 'junior king' by the Archbishop of York, angering Becket.
- Henry II and Thomas Becket resolve some of their differences. Becket returns to England.
- Thomas Becket excommunicates the bishops involved in Henry the Young King's coronation.
- Thomas Becket is murdered by knights who overheard Henry II's outburst.
- Henry II seeks forgiveness for his involvement in Becket's death.
