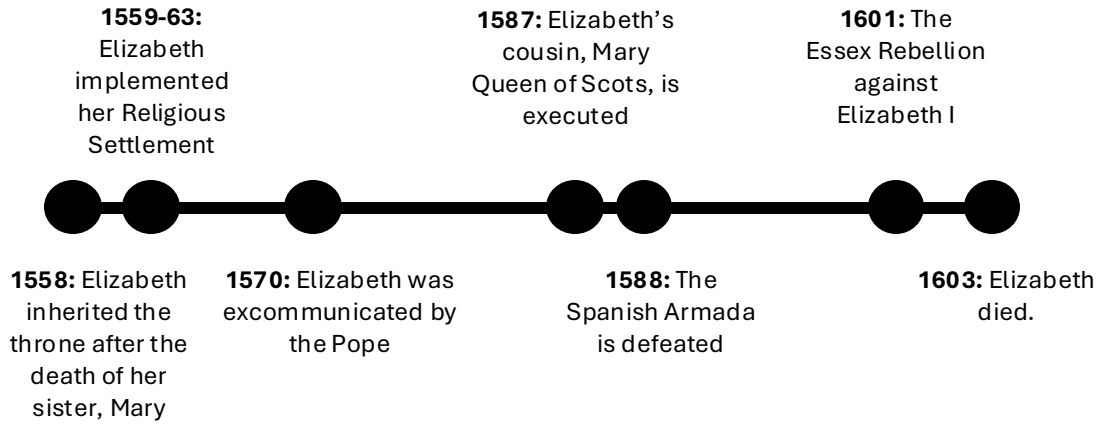

Armada	a fleet of warships	Jesuits	priests who try to spread Catholicism
Crisis	a difficult or dangerous time	Patriarchy	when society is dominated by males, eg. Positions of power and authority, social status, jobs, etc.
Compromise	an agreement of a dispute that is reached by each side making sacrifices	Privy council	a monarch's closest advisors
Execution	putting someone to death as a legal punishment	Puritan	a very strict form of Protestant
