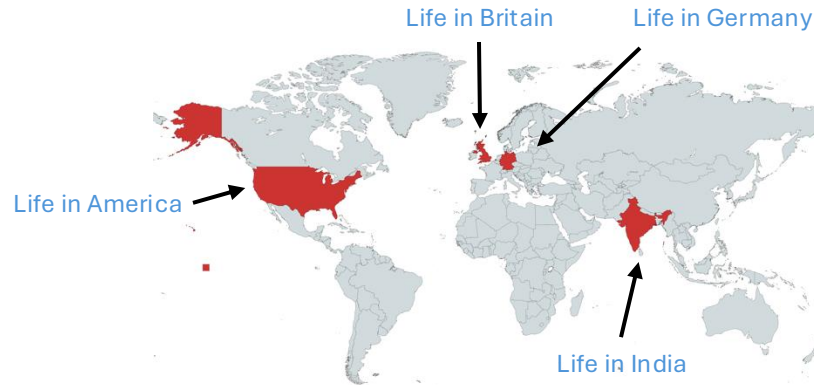

Keyword	Definition	Keyword	Definition
Colony	a country that is part of another country's empire (it is controlled by another country)	Infer	learning something from a piece of evidence
Dictated	when something is given as an order that has to be followed	Massacre	the act of killing large numbers of people, especially those who are helpless or defenceless
Equality	treating everyone fairly and giving them the same opportunities, regardless of their differences	Racism	when people are treated differently because of their skin colour or background
General strike	where huge numbers of workers, across many different segments of employment, refuse to work	Reliable	trustworthy (when studying primary sources of evidence)
Hyperinflation	when money loses all value and prices increase dramatically	Source evaluation	using own knowledge to critically examine a piece of evidence and determine how credible or accurate it is
