This year's summer school saw over 180 students attend in the first week of the summer holidays. Shuttleworth teachers planned and delivered a range of engaging sessions to ensure the newest members of the Shuttleworth family started to think big, chase dreams and succeed together.

From beautiful creations in art, to science experiments, challenging discussions in humanities and exceptional writing in English, students really engaged and rose to the challenges we set. We also had an exciting array of guests including oracy specialists from Talk the Talk, a London theatre company, a skipping workshop, author and 30-foot an а inflatable planetarium from Lancaster University.

All week staff were ably supported by a number of newly appointed prefects and ambassadors who proved invaluable throughout the course of the week.













SAFETY ASSEMBLIES

In September all year groups have had an assembly and form discussions focused time safety. This has included ensuring students understand our procedures. In the library we had information and key staff for SEND, inclusion, literacy and careers.







We look forward to visiting the park with our current year 10 students later this academic year.








Create Education & BAE Systems Partnership

The Creative **Technologies** faculty are exceedingly fortunate to be involved in a five year partnership with Create Education and BAE Systems. specifically The programme focuses on inspiring our young people to embrace and develop skills associated with the fasting of additive arowina area manufacturing technology- 3D printing. Our involvement has enabled us to increase our own skills within the area, but also incorporate 3D scanning and 3D printing within our curriculum.

Over the next two terms, 60 students in both Year 8 and 9 will have the opportunity to take part in a 3D design and printing workshop lead by the experts from Create Education.

The Challenge Task sessions will begin with Ms Walsh and Mr Lund on Monday 2nd October from 3.15-4.15pm. If you are interested in taking part, please see Ms Walsh and sign up as places are limited!



We will also be taking part in a Lancashire-wide challenge as part of our after-school enrichment programme. Students that are involved will work in teams to design and make a 3D printed prototype that will aid in improving the environment in and around a waterway or improve the habitat for one or more species of wildlife. The most successful outcomes from our pupils will then be judged against those entered by other schools and prizes awarded by BAE Systems.



OPERATION ENCOMPASS

Operation Encompass is a national scheme that operates jointly between schools and all police forces.

.....⊗PERATION

Children who live in homes where there is domestic abuse, or who experience domestic abuse in their own teenage relationships, can be negatively impacted by this experience.

We have ensured that a member of our staff, (Designated Safeguarding Lead) known as a Key Adult, has been trained about Operation Encompass procedures. This allows us to use the information that has been confidentially shared with us by the police, to understand how a child may be impacted by domestic abuse and to then offer support to the child/ren in our care.

This information means that we can understand a child's behaviour and support that child in whatever way they may need or want. Children who experience domestic abuse are recognised as victims of domestic abuse in their own right¹.

Operation Encompass means that our school will be told, prior to the start of the next school day, when police have attended an incident of domestic abuse where there is a child or young person who attends our school who is related to any of those involved in the incident.

We are keen to offer the very best support possible to all our pupils and we believe that being part of Operation Encompass helps us to do this.
