
Above the stage was a screen with projected live video of students from different schools in the audience on it.


Overall, we had an excellent time watching the orchestra, and our students will remember the experience for a lifetime.

Our reception team is the first point of contact for our school.

Ultimately, we ensure the front desk welcomes guests positively, and executes all administrative tasks to the highest quality standards. We also help the students with any queries, timetables and anything else we can assist them with.



CAREERS OFFICE

Mrs Ackroyd is our Careers Leader in school and Ms Lewis is the Careers Administrator. At Shuttleworth College, we:

- Ensure every student has at least one Information, Advice & Guidance (IAG) appointment by the end of Year 11, complete with individual action plan and resources for further research.
- Offer Year 11 application and CV support sessions for students to prepare for their next steps.
- Organise Year 10 ASPIRE week, with a range of education, training and employability activities so students can explore lots of future options.
- Help Year 9 students consider their GCSE options choices.
- Help teaching staff include careers education in every subject, so that students understand the skills they are developing, the links between subjects and the workplace and progression opportunities.
- Organise trips, visits and speakers for all students so that they can explore the world of work.



The Careers Office is based in the atrium so we're really easy for students to find. We love helping students discover the variety of future opportunities awaiting them and watching them progress after Year 11.

THE GENERAL OFFICE



The general office offers general administrative support for teaching and non-teaching staff.

We play a crucial role in the day-to-day life of school by providing a range of administrative support to keep everything running as smoothly as possible.



A few of the things we help with include typing collating letters. information for school keeping trips, pupil records up to date as well monitoring stationery as supplies and re-ordering when The necessary. management of the school app also takes place in the general office.

HR DEPARTMENT

In the HR department we mainly deal with recruitment of new staff. We carry out DBS checks and other checks to make sure that all staff have the appropriate qualifications and training to carry out their role. We also look after the wellbeing of all staff in school, making sure that staff physical and mental health is being looked after. We arrange training and courses including annual safeguarding training. We run induction days to welcome new staff and update HR records ensuring that they are compliant with Ofsted.



FINANCE DEPARTMENT

The finance team deal with the budgets for school. They order stock and supplies for school and oversee ParentPay which parents use for paying for school trips.





REPROGRAPHICS & MARKETING

Reprographics provides full and efficient reprographic support to all teaching and support staff on a daily basis. Advice is given on the most cost effective way to provide class resources etc and requests for printing, copying and scanning are completed in a timely manner to meet any deadlines set.

Reprographics also makes sure the additional mutifunction devices and printers around the school are in good working order and well stocked with supplies.

Marketing supports in the design and creation publications for the school. ranges This from class resources, posters, leaflets, newsletters to event publications and social media content.





Marketing are also involved in the organisation of filming and photography of the school to post both internally and externally on various media channels.

The school's social media platforms and website are also managed by the Marketing Department.






EXAMS & ASSESSMENT

In the exams and assessment data office we manage the administration aspects of exams, data collection for school reports, produce data analysis and also look after the school and student timetables.

We manage exam entries, prepare timetables, make arrangements for the day of the exams, make sure that relevant paperwork and tasks are completed for the exam boards and arrange results days. Although the main exams are always in the Summer term, we are kept busy all year round with other school exams, such as two sets of Year 11 Mock exams and end of year exams for each year group. We also manage a lovely team of invigilators who staff our exams and make sure that all and procedures quidance are followed.





We oversee the assessment software in school where we produce spreadsheets to collect data for producing the school reports received by parents and carers and also produce data analysis for senior leaders, curriculum leaders and subject teachers.

We are also responsible for the upkeep of the school timetable, making sure that it is kept up to date with any changes to class rooms and staff throughout the year. We manage student class changes and add any alternative provision to student timetables.

SAVING MONEY AND IMPROVING WELL-BEING, ONE COURSE AT A TIME

Lancashire Adult Learning Launches Initiative to Combat Cost-of-Living Crisis

Lancashire Adult Learning (LAL) has launched an initiative to combat the cost-of-living crisis and improve well-being in the local community. The initiative, running alongside their Multiply project, is aimed at teaching the art of frugality through cutting costs, living smarter and improving well-being during trying times.

The free courses are now up and running and are taking place throughout the year. These can be attended both online and in person in various locations across Lancashire. Learners can register their interest through accessing the Lancashire Adult Learning website. There are a number of unique offerings available, and the courses are mostly targeted at issues that face the Lancashire community during times of economic hardship.

Courses on offer include bill management and financial budgeting, which aim to help attendees better manage their finances and convey handy hints and tips to sizably cut down their gas and electric bills. Cooking and meal preparing on a tight budget is also part of the curriculum, where the focus is cheap quick and easy meals that are both filling and nutritious without breaking the bank.

These courses are open to all members of the community, including employers, partners, low-income and unemployed learners, as well as those in employment who are struggling to make ends meet.

Furthermore, LAL have other initiatives targeting the cost-of-living crisis including coping with stress and anxiety, and improving mobility at home that will aim to improve the happiness and well-being of the local Lancashire community. Employers are invited to consider utilizing these offerings in order to provide their employees with unique and effective support regarding their mental, physical, and financial well-being.

Local libraries are similarly supporting their community by offering cost-of-living support, namely through their Warm Spaces initiative, which invited the local community into their warm libraries with various incentives, including the following:

- a warm drink.
- a space to sit.
- free computers and Wi-Fi.
- charging points for your phone or laptop.
- events and activities.
- help from staff to find information.

Partner organizations can also request cost-of-living support for their service users to support people during these challenging times.

When commenting on the cost-of-living courses, Tom Gee, Head Of Curriculum: Employability, Volunteering and Skills at LAL said "Lancashire Adult Learning is proud to be supporting the community through innovative and practical programs in response to the cost-of-living crisis.

"We understand that times are tough and that people are struggling to make ends meet. That's why we have developed these courses, to provide practical and helpful advice to help people manage their finances and improve their overall well-being."

LAL's initiative is a timely and relevant response to the ongoing cost-of-living crisis and will provide valuable support to the local Lancashire community. The courses are free, easily accessible, and cover a wide range of topics to help people improve their financial situation and overall well-being.



OPERATION ENCOMPASS

Operation Encompass is a national scheme that operates jointly between schools and all police forces.

Children who live in homes where there is domestic abuse, or who experience domestic abuse in their own teenage relationships, can be negatively impacted by this experience.

We have ensured that a member of our staff, (Designated Safeguarding Lead) known as a Key Adult, has been trained about Operation Encompass procedures. This allows us to use the information that has been confidentially shared with us by the police, to understand how a child may be impacted by domestic abuse and to then offer support to the child/ren in our care.

This information means that we can understand a child's behaviour and support that child in whatever way they may need or want.

Children who experience domestic abuse are recognised as victims of domestic abuse in their own right¹.

Operation Encompass means that our school will be told, prior to the start of the next school day, when police have attended an incident of domestic abuse where there is a child or young person who attends our school who is related to any of those involved in the incident.

We are keen to offer the very best support possible to all our pupils and we believe that being part of Operation Encompass helps us to do this.
