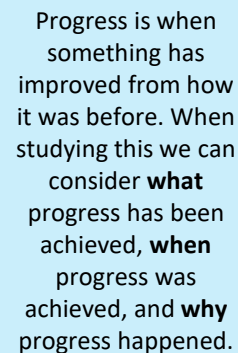
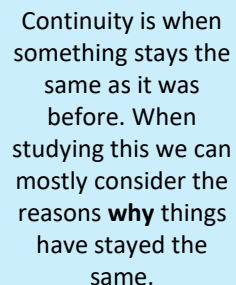
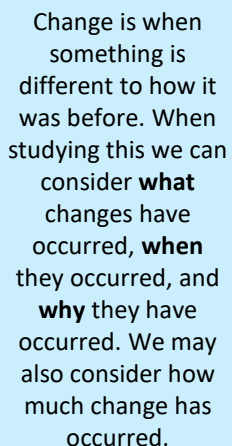

Keyword	Definition	Keyword	Definition
Asylum Seeker:	A person who has asked a government to recognise their status as a refugee and is waiting to hear the outcome.	Immigrant:	Someone who moves into another country.
Attitudes:	the way you feel about something	Migration:	the movement of people/animals from their usual place of residence to another location
Disability:	a physical or mental impairment, where the impairment has a substantial and long-term adverse effect on their ability to carry out normal day-to-day activities	NHS:	National Health Service
Emigrant:	Someone who moves out of a country.	Racism:	when someone is treated unfairly because of their race, which is their skin colour, where they come from, or their background.
Forced Migration:	When people have little or no choice to move. This might be because of a natural disaster; they are facing persecution or are fleeing war.	Refugees:	People who have been forced to leave their homes to escape war, persecution or natural disaster. They have a right to international protection.
Gender equality:	everyone, regardless of their gender, has the same rights, opportunities, and responsibilities	Voluntary Migration:	When people choose to move countries. This might be to find a better job or to improve their quality of life.
