## What are we learning?

In this topic, we'll explore the 'big idea' through studying a range of short stories and extracts that use a variety of unconventional perspectives as part of their narratives. We will practise how to innovate narratives to write the same story from another perspective, which will help our empathy skills. We will also spend time developing our knowledge of paragraphing, punctuation and language techniques from year 8 and apply this to our writing.
