

Sir Eduardo Luigi Paolozzi

(7 March 1924 – 22 April 2005) was a Scottish artist, known for his sculpture and graphic works. He was the son of Italian parents.

He was a founder of Pop Art and liked to combine machinery and figures within his artwork. Paolozzi created collages, prints, sculpture and textiles.

Sonia Delaunay

(13 November 1885 – 5 December 1979) was born in Ukraine, but spent much of her working life in Paris, France.

She practised in painting, textiles, fashion and set design.

Her work is abstract and based on geometric forms.



Kathy Dalwood is a British artist who works using plaster and concrete casting.

She makes sculptures, friezes and commissions- including a series of concrete tiles created for a hotel owned by Pharrell Williams!





geometric: characterized by or decorated with regular lines and shapes

When working with clay you...

- must <u>NOT</u> release clay dust into the atmosphere by banging or waving equipment with dry clay on
 - must wipe down all surfaces with a damp cloth then dry them

overlaid shapes with the same centre point
items made from clay and hardened by heat
a method of moulding of carving when a design stands out from the surface
a mix of water and clay used to stick two pieces of clay together
a liquid painted and fused onto clay with heat to create an impervious surface
a substance created by mixing powdered gypsum and water
the process of pouring a material into a mould
a mark impressed on a surface
a method of creating three-dimensional forms in clay using manipulated slabs

Considering **composition** in your work is exceedingly important. Compositional techniques give layout and structure to each art piece and helps to lead the eye of the observer through or across it.









Rule of Thirds

Ceramic glazes...

glaze (noun)

'an impervious layer or coating of a vitreous substance which has been fused to a ceramic body through firing'

impervious (adj)

doesn't allow liquid to pass through

vitreous (adj)

derived from or containing glass

Ceramic glazes contain silica- this is what is found in the sand used to make glass. It is silica that makes a glaze shiny.

Glazes are used to add colour, decoration and make ceramic items waterproof.









Slab building...

The ceramic technique of slab building starts with smooth slabs of clay that are formed around moulds or shaped and cut by hand.

The slabs can be layered, joined with others and also decorated using addition and/or reduction

techniques.

There are two slab building methods: soft slab and stiff-slab. The stiff-slab method is more appropriate for architectural and geometric forms. The slab is rolled and then allowed to slowly dry to the leatherhard stage before being cut and joined with other stiffened slabs to create the form.







Slabs can be laid into **slump moulds** or draped over **hump moulds** in order to achieve different forms.
